REAL ID Extended to May 7, 2025

The Department of Homeland Security extended the REAL ID deadline to May 7, 2025. The REAL ID Act established minimum security standards for state-issued driver's licenses and identification cards and prohibits Federal agencies from accepting for official purposes licenses and identification cards from states that do not meet these standards. Beginning May 7, 2025,

every state and territory resident will need to present a REAL ID compliant license/ID, or another acceptable form of ID for boarding commercial aircraft, accessing Federal facilities and entering nuclear plants. The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) considers a current passport or military ID acceptable identification for boarding an aircraft. Belize shines among Caribbean jewels Natural wonders and beauty define special location

peaceful, green oasis sits between Mexico and Guatemala. It's rich in beauty and blessed with the magic of its Maya past. Its mountains are draped with waterfalls. Dense lowlands give way to rolling grasslands. Every breeze wafts the scent of tree ferns and orchids. Howler monkeys speak their own language from the jungle.

Also known as a diver's paradise, it has spectacular coral gardens, a bevy of marine life and crystal-blue waters.

Whale sharks emerge from the depths of the Caribbean Sea from March through June. They measure as long as 45 feet and feed by sucking on plankton and tiny fish. Divers swim in harmony with these gentle creatures that share attributes with other sharks except one: they have no teeth.

Belize has grown into a popular cruise destination during the past decade. Ships call in at Belize City – the country's largest town.

Christopher Columbus reached Belize in 1502, but the initial European settlers – British sailors – shipwrecked on the country years earlier. It's the only Central American country that has English as its official language.

A sandy secluded beach, palm trees and clear waters encompass Ambergris Caye – the real-life locale of reality show "Temptation Island". Sunbathers

relish catching rays from a clear sky that is dotted with puffy clouds. Belize's largest offshore island is populated by luxury resorts and offers world-class diving at Hol Can Marina Reserve.

Jacques Cousteau first explored the Great Blue Hole in 1971 on nearby Lighthouse Reef Atoll. It's the largest sea hole in the world and is recognizable from space. Submerged at the end of the Ice Age more than 10,000 years ago, the Great Blue Hole is 984 feet across and 354 feet deep. It's considered one of the best dive sites in the world.

Visitors can take a meandering, 37-mile drive from Belize City up the Western Highway to reach the Caves Branch River. The waterway snakes through the Maya mountains. Guides hand out headlamps for a float through the limestone-cave system on an innertube. Crystalline formations like the cave, and majestic stalagmites and stalactites sparkle like icicles in the dark recess of the cave.

Nearly two-thirds of Belize is labeled as nature preserves. Guests can spot more than 540 species. The Mountain Pine Ridge – a 300-square-mile reserve – is home to the thousand-foot Hidden Valley Falls, exotic tapirs and five species of wildcats, including the jaguar.

The Cockscomb Basin Wildlife Sanctuary sprawls more than 128,000 acres of tropical jungle. It's home to the world's first jaguar reserve. Hikers discover rare flora and fauna, a plethora of waterfalls and Victoria Peak – Belize's second-tallest mountain.

Belize served as an epicenter of the ancient Maya civilization. Caracol is the largest Maya destination and covers 65-square miles – an area twice the size of Belize City. The 155-foot-tall Caana – or Sky Palace – has been abandoned more than a thousand years. Yet it remains the highest manmade structure in the country.

Belize is a tropical paradise. Grandeur defines its nature and beauty its sandy shorelines. Travelers shouldn't hesitate to dive right in.

night. It results in a richer and more fulfilling small-cruise experience.

Time is your best friend when traveling to new and exciting destinations. Another advantage is sailing on a smaller ship, perfectly sized to cruise across oceans and scenic waterways, and dock at off-the-beaten-path locations, as well as world-renowned ones.

Begin your trip in Denmark. Its capital, Copenhagen, is known as the "City of Spires." Its medieval core is punctuated by the steeples of churches and towers of palaces.

Spend two days in Gdansk, Poland. It's a port city on the Baltic more than 1,000 years in age. It teams with Gdynia and Sopot to create the fantastic metropolitan area of Trojmiasto – also known as the "Tricity."

Riga is Latvia's capital. It's set on the Baltic Sea at the mouth of the River Daugava. A cultural center, it's home to museums and concert halls. Wooden buildings, art nouveau and its medieval Old Town rank it among the most interesting of its kind in Europe.

A traveler's paradise can be found in Estonia – Tallinn, to be exact. Little has changed in the capital city over numerous centuries. Its medieval influences can be recognized in its architecture and art. Visit St. Olav's Church – once the tallest building in the world – before having a seat at a charming café in the town square, the heart of the city for 800 years.

Finland offers a trifecta of exploration and enjoyment. Visit three cities in three days and leave with a plethora of unforgettable times.

Kotka is tucked away on the world's largest archipelago and delivers an exceptional island lifestyle. Kotka is blessed with architecturally stunning museums, award-winning parks and other attractions sure to grab your attention. Take an archipelago cruise, hike to Tsar's fishing lodge or take part in a beer-tasting tour.

Helsinki – Finland's capital city – blends traditional and modern architecture and design with nature and a few quirky touches that include a church built inside an enormous chunk of granite. Day 1: Arrive in Copenhagen and transfer to your hotel in a prime location for a two-night stay. Enjoy a free afternoon in evening to explore this ancient city on your own. Copenhagen has a rich history as a major city on the edge of the Baltic. It grew from a little fishing town to the capital of Denmark. It has survived fire, plague, invasion and just about everything in between. Perhaps visit the world-famous Tivoli gardens, then enjoy dinner at one of the local restaurants.

Day 2: Breakfast is included at our hotel this morning. Today, we drive to Kronborg Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Known as the setting of Shakespeare's Hamlet, the castle is located in Elsinore with views across to Sweden facing the sound. Once the home of kings and queens, a fortified castle with bastions and cannon batteries that controlled the water in the narrowest point between Sweden and Denmark, the castle's history is fascinating. We return to Copenhagen to enjoy an included lunch at the local Skipperkroen Restaurant. We then embark on a Classic Canal cruise. Hear how Copenhagen became the fantastic city it is today. Learn about the city's founding father, the best place to get Danish Smorrebrod "butter bread," a traditional open-faced sandwich in the cuisines of Denmark, and why the Danes are called the happiest people in the world. Our tour ends in Nyhavn, a 17th-century waterfront that is now an entertainment district. Here we enjoy some free time and we can walk back to our hotel.

Day 3: Copenhagen (Ship departs: 6 p.m. August 11). Enjoy a leisurely breakfast at the hotel. This afternoon, transfer to the *Azamara Onward* for the beginning of our Baltic Adventure.
