# Sphere is a venue unlike any other Las Vegas' newest arena lights up your senses

he Las Vegas Strip is a catwalk for architectural opulence. It's the only place worldwide where you can visit Paris, Egypt, ancient Rome and New York City all on the same roadway. So, it should come as no surprise that its newest entertainment venue puts an exclamation point on its celebrated reputation.

Sphere is as unique as it innovative. The world's largest spherical venue – to no one's surprise – boasts a commanding presence. The structure stands 366 feet high and is 516 feet wide; enough volume to conceal the Statue of Liberty.

It's more than twice the height of the domes on Spaceship Earth at Walt Disney World® Resort's Epcot. Does it get anymore Las Vegas?

Sphere's 580,000-square-foot Exosphere is comprised of 1.2 million LED lights that are each the size of a hockey puck, making it the largest LED screen on Earth. Each diode is capable of displaying 256 million different colors.

Essentially, the surface is a blank palette for creativity in animation and it will be illuminated every day and night.

"Sphere Exosphere is a 360-degree canvas for brand storytelling that will be seen around the world," said David Hopkinson, president and chief operating officer of MSG Sports. "There's

nothing comparable to the impact from displaying innovative brand and immersive content on the world's largest video screen."

Nothing is out of question. Sphere could share the appearance of a basketball. It could be an eyeball, a jack-o'-lantern, the moon, Christmas snow globe,

sayings ... The options are unlimited and the future sits in the present.

"The Exosphere is more than a screen or a billboard," said Guy Barnett, senior vice president of brand strategy and creative development at MSG Sphere. "It is living architecture, and unlike anything that exists anywhere in the world. There are possibilities for artists, partners and brands to create compelling and impactful stories with audiences in new ways."

Sphere, which opened on September 29, with "U2:UV Achtung Baby Live at Sphere", cost \$2.3 billion to build. It seats more than 18,000 and sits a block east of the Strip and will be connected by a pedestrian walkway to the Venetian resort complex. Guests will be able to enjoy immersive shows, concerts, sporting events and other entertainment productions.

The acts onstage are dwarfed by a towering 16K LED screen that wraps around much of the audience and can augment the concert experience with trippy animations or close-ups of performers.

There are more than 160,000 speakers spread throughout the bowl that deliver pristine sound to every seat – no matter where you are sitting. The venue also is equipped with haptic seats that can vibrate to match whatever is onscreen and 4D machines that can create wind, temperature and scent effects.

Sphere is a venue unlike any other. No stone is unturned or door unopened. It's an opening meant to peek into the future of entertainment.

In other words, it's Las Vegas, through and through.

# **Exercise helps keep older drivers on road** Fatigue, other issues cause aging adults to stop driving

eeping physically fit has a host of benefits. Staying behind the wheel of vehicle is one of them.

The AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety found that increased fatigue and poor physical functioning are leading factors that can result in older adults limiting their driving. Simple steps, though, like weekly exercise and stretching, can improve safe driving abilities and keep older adults on the road longer.

The AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety commissioned researchers from Columbia University to evaluate eight domains – depression, anxiety, fatigue, sleep disturbance, pain interference, physical functioning, pain intensity and participation in social activities – to determine how changes in physical, mental and social health affect driving mobility for older adults. The report found that fatigue and poor physical functioning are most common among older drivers who spend less time behind the wheel.

"Older adults who give up the keys are more likely to suffer from depression than those who remain behind the wheel," said Dr. David Yang, executive director of the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety. "It is important that we find ways to keep older drivers

in good physical health in order to extend their mobility."

Research shows that daily exercise and stretching can help older drivers improve overall body flexibility and move more freely to observe the road from all angles. Physical strength also helps drivers remain alert to potential hazards on the road and perform essential driving functions, like:

- Braking
- Steering
- Parking
- Looking to the side and rear
- Adjusting the safety belts
- Sitting for long periods of time "Some decline in physical fitness is involved by the property of the proper

inevitable as we age," said Jake Nelson, AAA director of traffic safety advocacy and research. "But research shows that exercise doesn't have to be strenuous to produce positive results. You can spread out the time you spend being physically active over the course of your day and week. A few minutes at a time can be sufficient. Simple steps to keep active can keep you driving safely for longer."

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends older adults, who are physically able, get between 2-5 hours of moderate-intensity exercise each week or between 75 minutes to 2.5 hours of high-intensity physical activity.

Older adults should consult their doctor before beginning the new exercise regimen. They also should talk with a healthcare provider about ways to combat fatigue. Prioritize getting at least seven hours of sleep each night to stay focused while driving.

AAA recommends a series of stretches to improve neck, shoulder, trunk, back and overall body flexibility. AAA also offers a variety of programs and resources to help older adults improve their driving performance and avoid crashes.

## Lifeless trees come to life in Petrified Forest Arizona national park a mysterious land where time stands still

ew things have aged better than Petrified Forest National Park. Its history dates nearly 220 million years.

Located in northeast Arizona, the park features one of the world's largest and most colorful arrays of petrified wood. It's as stunning as it is unique. Fossils tell tales of prehistoric Earth and its inhabitants. Early dinosaurs and reptiles roamed the area.

The trees – nearly pure quartz – stoke curiosity, opening your eyes to a land few places on Earth can match. The rainbow-like coloring and intricate patterns are the results of the minerals and imperfections found in the wood.

Step back in time to a place before humans existed. The sights are profound. Eons of history lay before you in a variety of shapes and sizes. Artifacts bring to life the Triassic Period.

Interest in the area began to grow during the late-19th century, prompting the Arizona Territorial legislature to petition Congress to protect its resources. By 1906, President Theodore Roosevelt created Petrified Forest National Monument. It was elevated to national park status in 1962.

This geological playground encompasses 220,000 acres. The location receives fewer than 10 inches of rain annually, allowing a clear, blue sky to

mesh perfectly with the desert terrain.

There are many ways to explore the park. View it by vehicle and take advantage of stops at overlooks. Walk one of the many short trails or hike the backcountry along one of the Off the Beaten Path routes. Crystal Forest Trail and Giant Logs Loop provide up-close visuals meant to leave lasting impressions.

There are fossils, badlands, buttes and mesas, ancient petroglyphs, wild-life and wildflowers and vast vistas. The Painted Desert offers solitude, allowing you to collect your thoughts while exploring the mysterious surroundings.

Sightsee via bicycle or horse – you just have to bring your horse. Rangers, scientists, cultural demonstrators and

other field experts lead guided tours. Their knowledge enhances the experience.

There are plenty of sights to visit, including:

- Newspaper Rock that has more than 650 petroglyphs that are believed to have been created between 1499 B.C. and 1000 A.D.
- The Teepees, rock formations comprised of bands of crimson, gray, blue, purple and white rock.
- Agate Home, a reconstructed Puebloan domicile created primarily from petrified wood.
   Plue Mose a landform that is
- Blue Mesa, a landform that is considered to be one of the best ways to see the beautiful blue, pink, gray and purple hills.
- Agate Bridge, a petrified log that rests over a washed-out hollow.

Myths abound. Perhaps none more popular than claims of bad luck to anyone who takes petrified wood past the park's boundaries. A curse awaited those eager to bring home souvenirs.

The legend became so deep that hundreds of people have returned chunks of wood with apology letters, according to the book "Bad Luck, Hot Rocks." Park officials named the stack of returned rocks the "conscience pile."

That shouldn't be surprising. Petrified wood is scarce. It doesn't need to be scary.
