'24 brings more digital paperwork to E.U. travel

Visiting Europe soon will require more than a passport. The European Union will implement new visa requirements – known as the European Travel Information and Authorization System (ETIAS) – for non-EU passport holders in 2024. A specific date when this requirement will go into effect has yet to be determined.

ETIAS visas are not physical documents but are electronically linked to the traveler's passport. In order to apply, travelers will need to provide their passport information or another travel document to which a visa can be affixed. Parents and legal guardians can apply on

behalf of minors in their care.

ETIAS approval is valid for three years or until the passport under which it is registered expires, whichever comes first. The processing fee is set at 7 euros – or \$7.74 – but applicants under the age of 18 or older than 70 can apply at no charge.

The application process shouldn't take long. According to the E.U., the ETIAS approval should come within minutes for most applicants but can take up to 30 days. The government encourages travelers to apply well in advance of any trip, and strongly **advises** travelers to receive their ETIAS approval prior to purchasing flights or booking hotels.

Fall brings new challenges to motorists

Wet leaves, cooler temps are among serious factors

There never is a good time to lessen our safety behind the wheel. Driving **is privilege**. How seriously we approach it could be the difference between life and death.

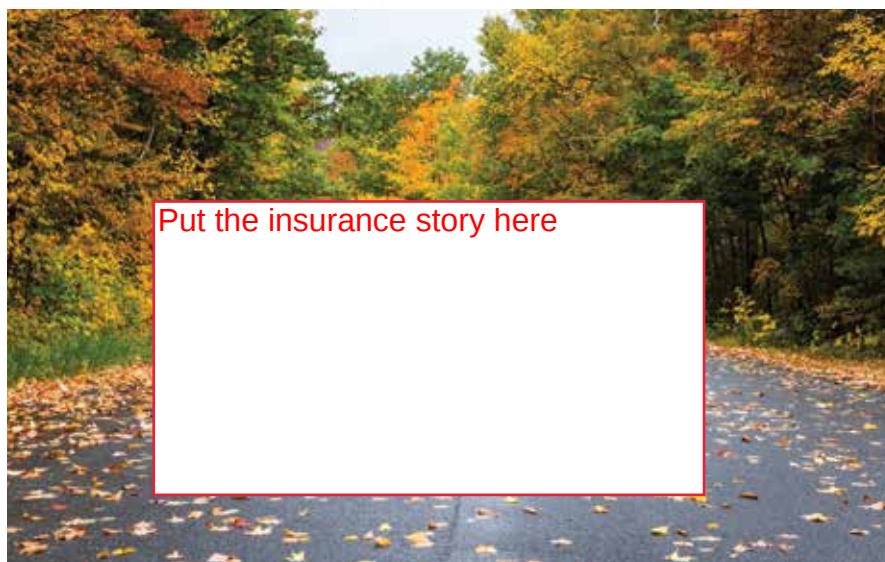
That is why our habits evolve with the seasons. It's essential in maintaining our safety on the roadways. The transition from summer to autumn might not seem serious, but it shouldn't be taken lightly.

Less light and cooler temperatures become more common during fall months. Wet leaves, which could cause a **vehicle** slide, and other significant factors increase the importance of safe-driving habits.

Motorists commuting to their places of work early likely will be driving under nighttime circumstances. It increases the importance of keeping headlights clean or having them replaced should they begin to show signs of deterioration.

Autumn is the season for leaf-peepers, but that also means leaf-covered roads are inevitable. Wet leaves can cause roadways to become slick. Driving at higher speeds could force the car to skid off the road or into another car or barrier, like a lamppost or guardrail.

Check tire pressure daily. Extreme changes in temperatures will cause tires to expand and contract, which could lead to a loss in tire pressure. Prior to

starting a vehicle, drivers should clear frost from their windows and check that the tires are properly inflated and have plenty of tread.

Fog is another concern. Cold mornings often lead to foggier conditions. Drivers should set their headlights to low beams. High beams bounce off fog and reflect to the driver, further impairing the ability to see the road. Low beams aim downward and

improve visibility.

It also is wise to slow down. Keep an ample distance from the vehicle ahead. It allows for more time to brake should the leading car's brake lights be shrouded by the heavy fog.

Glare is another concern. Autumn sunrises and sunsets can cause significant glare, making it difficult to see other vehicles, pedestrians, traffic lights or roadways. To combat this:

Autumn is the season for leaf-peepers, but that also means leaf-covered roads are inevitable. Wet leaves can cause roadways to become slick. Driving at higher speeds could force the car to skid off the road or into another car or barrier, like a lamppost or guardrail.

- Clean windshields inside and out to remove dust particles, streaks and smudges. These can become magnified when illuminated by sunlight and impact visibility.
- Avoid using washing and waxing products that increase a car's shine. They magnify the sun's glare on the vehicle, which could cause the light to reflect into the driver's eyes and cause a blinding effect.
- And keep a pair of sunglasses in the vehicle to protect vision from the sun's rays. Those who frequently travel at night should consider buying lenses with anti-reflective coating to reduce glare from streetlights and headlights.

Nashville park, campus are afternoon delights

Centennial Park, Vanderbilt University provide peace, culture

Nightlife personifies Nashville. It's the primary reason millions of travelers visit.

But how does one fill a day in Music City?

Simple answer: Centennial Park.

The urban park sits a couple of miles from the heart of Broadway's honky-tonks and across the road from Vanderbilt University. It's a peaceful and stunning open area blessed with wide walkways, beautiful landscaping, a stunning lake and pieces of history.

Guests flock to find spots on its vast lawn to take in the sun, play sports or walk the Centennial Park Loop around Lake Watauga – a blissful waterway surrounded by lush trees, groomed shrubbery and colorful flowers.

Centennial Park is home to the Tennessee Woman Suffrage Monument, recognizing a group of women who devoted their lives to fighting for women's equality.

The monument is centrally located and highlighted by statues depicting Carrie Chapman Catt, Anne Dallas Dudley, Abby Crawford Milton, Juno Frankie Pierce and Sue Shelton White standing tall and fighting for voting rights. The sculptures are surrounded by plaques latched to stone walls, telling stories about which few people have heard.

The centerpiece of Centennial Park

is a massive architectural wonder. Stone columns jut from all sides, highlighting craftsmanship so detailed you might believe you've been teleported from Nashville to Athenian Acropolis, Greece.

The Parthenon in Centennial Park is a full-scale replica of the Greek original. Walk its steps to experience its impactful exterior. Have a seat and appreciate the pinnacle of classical architecture.

Nicknamed the "Athens of the South", it served as the centerpiece of

the 1897 Centennial Exposition and was fully completed by 1925. It maintains its exquisiteness more than a century later.

A multi-floor art museum resides inside the Parthenon. The gallery is home to more than 100 paintings, exhibits and sculptures that include a full-scale replica of the statue Athena Parthenos. The gold and ivy structure stands between columns and rises 42-feet high while facing a pair of bronze doors that measure 24 feet in height and weigh 7.5 tons each.

The museum is open Tuesday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Sunday from 12:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Admission is \$10 for adults, and \$8 for senior citizens and children.

Vanderbilt University, meanwhile, sits a short walk from the park. Explore one of the U.S.'s most prestigious schools founded in 1873 by Commodore Cornelius Vanderbilt. The business titan donated \$1 million (the equivalent of \$25.3 billion today) with the wish that it should "contribute to strengthening the ties which should exist between all geographical sections of our common country."

A statue of the Commodore stands tall at the base of one of the entrances. It's a popular spot to take photos and it opens a doorway into higher education.

The urban campus perfectly blends a collection of older and modern buildings highlighted by West End Tower. The structure rises 300-feet high, making it the second-tallest Collegiate Gothic/Gothic Revival building in the U.S., trailing only the University of Pittsburgh's Cathedral of Learning (535 feet). Walk sidewalks lined by trees, cross quiet roadways and appreciate the splendor.

It makes for a quite fulfilling afternoon, proving Nashville is more than a one-trick pony – no matter how many pairs of cowboy boots you might see on Broadway.

American Cruise Lines shines spotlight on Volunteer State

People seem surprised when they learn I started at AAA as an insurance agent and transferred into the Travel Agency, but with my

positive, outgoing personality, it seemed like helping our members plan their dream vacation was a better fit.

My bucket list has taken me to cold destinations like Iceland and Alaska, but my most recent travels were on two contrasting River Cruises: a Viking cruise in Europe, and an American Cruise Lines' voyage on the American Serenade.

The Serenade is American Cruise Lines' newest ship and holds 185 passengers. We were the 12th sailing on a repositioning cruise from Nashville to Memphis. The clients were mature, active and repeat cruisers.

My balcony cabin was spacious, and I was impressed by the two-room, ADA-accessible and single cabins that I toured. The ship is cashless. My trip included a two-night, pre-cruise stay in Nashville, transfers to the vessel, guided tours, unlimited wines, beers & spirits, and Wi-Fi. The nightly entertainment varied and included country,

bluegrass and an American Idol finalist.

Days at sea were packed with Bozo Bingo (any false call out and you don a clown's nose), presentations by naturalists and historians, cooking demonstrations and trivia. My favorite onboard experience was the dining. I was assigned a personal chef, Chef David, the first day because of my specialized diet, and he served me throughout the cruise. He even packed my lunch for our excursion days.

Our pre-cruise stays in Nashville were at the famed Gaylord Opryland Hotel, with nine acres of indoor garden atriums,

waterfalls, pools and themed restaurants. We attended a performance of the Grand Ole Opry and went downtown to Honky Tonk Highway on Lower Broadway to hear the live local music. The next day, we toured the Parthenon in Centennial Park on our way to the ship.

While onboard, we sailed the Cumberland, Tennessee, Ohio and Mississippi rivers. The most unexpected experienced was Kentucky Lake, a navigable reservoir that was created in 1944 for flood control and hydroelectric power. It's also a recreational area with speedboats, jet skis

and sailboats.

The Tennessee ports of call were fun and historical. In **Clarkesville**, I took the morning Biscuit Bake-Off excursion that included lunch and Bluegrass music. Each team received their own biscuit recipe; Paula Deen's won.

In the afternoon, I toured the historical Fort Defiance Civil War Park and Interpretive center. At the next stop in Dover, I did the working farm, a national recreational park, where I fed a hog, rooster and hen.

In Kentucky, my favorite town was Paducah. In the 1990s, the city decided to reinvent itself and offered discounted housing to artists. Paducah is now a vibrant art scene, where 50 murals adorn the city's walls.

The town also is home to the National Quilt Museum, with more than 500 quilts on display. We disembarked in Memphis. For our tour, we could upgrade to the Graceland Experience excursion, or tour the National Civil Rights Museum, where Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated. The Museum was fascinating and presented a comprehensive overview of the American Civil Rights Movement from slavery to the present. Later that day, I toured the iconic Beale Street.

Nothing is comparable to touring our American heritage, and the staff onboard the ship and their service was unsurpassed. It was a trip not to miss!

Cybertheft a growing concern worldwide

Turn to AAA to take proactive approach to stop villains

Few things are more important than protecting our identities. Our personally identifiable information (PII) rests on the internet waiting to be plundered.

Cyberthieves work around the clock, searching for ways to infiltrate our computers. Cybertheft is expected to cost the world \$13.8 trillion by 2028.

October is recognized as National Cybersecurity Awareness Month. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security and the National Cyber Security Alliance collaborated to create this endeavor as a time to remind and inform individuals on the importance of protecting their PII from cybercriminals.

It's an enormous task, considering no amount of knowledge is guaranteed to keep information safe from cyberthieves. It's not *if*, but *when* a cyberattack occurs, how can a person limit the effect caused by the damages?

The best defense is to not make it so easy for a hacker to steal PII. Using strong passwords is essential. Passwords should have multiple characters, upper- and lower-case letters, numbers and symbols. The longer the better. Avoid using birthdates or anniversary dates. Don't capitalize the first letter without capitalizing others within the password.

Never write passwords on a sheet of paper, use the same one for multiple sites or give them to another person. Avoid

typing a password in an office setting without making sure another person isn't standing in the background. Shoulder surfing is a common method used by hackers to steal passwords.

Two-factor authentication decreases the odds of a password being stolen, and password generators can randomly produce words that could take as long as three centuries to crack.

Email is another concern. Phishing emails can be difficult to identify and are meant to steal PII or hold the computer

hostage. A hacker can lock a computer and its information until a monetary demand is met, but even then, there is no guarantee the information will be returned once the ransom is paid.

It's good practice to closely read the addresses from which emails are being sent if they seem suspicious. A message might read that it was sent by Microsoft, but there could be misspellings in the address – a primary red flag. Does the message address the user personally or randomly? Messages beginning "Dear sir"

or "To whom it may concern" are red flags. Poor grammar within the message is another red flag. Delete them immediately.

Maintaining updated antivirus software and using a firewall also are critical. Try to avoid visiting websites that have URL addresses beginning with "http" rather than "https." The "s" indicates the site is secure, and it's safe to visit. Following these steps can greatly reduce the odds of being hacked. PII in the wrong hands can steal a person's identity, ruin years of good credit or empty bank accounts.

Precautions keep Halloween a treat for all

AAA offers tips, safeguards to make sure everyone is safe

Halloween is synonymous with costumes and candy. It puts smiles on children’s faces and treats in their knapsacks. It’s a joyous night, but also one that could lead to dangerous situations.

Halloween is the deadliest day of the year for child-pedestrian fatalities. Children are three times more likely to be struck and killed by a car on the holiday than any other day of the year, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). One-fourth of all pedestrian deaths, ranging from ages 5-14, occurred in the four days prior to Halloween.

Precaution – by parents and motorists – is the best way to keep children from harm’s way. AAA offers these tips to stay safe on Halloween:

Parents

- Trick-or-treat together. Parents should accompany young trick-or-treaters at least until the age of 12.
- Choose costumes wisely. Make sure your child is visible by selecting a light-colored costume, or by adding reflective tape. Choose disguises that don’t obstruct vision and opt for non-toxic face paint rather than masks. Check and adjust the length of costumes to avoid tripping.
- Have a plan. Review trick-or-treating precautions, including pedestrian- and traffic-safety rules. Plan and discuss the route your trick-or-treaters will follow. Teach children to stop only at well-lit houses and to never enter a stranger’s home or garage. Tell your children not to eat treats until they return home.
- Stay on the sidewalk. If there are no sidewalks, walk as far to the left of the road as possible, facing traffic.
- Shine a light. Give everyone a glow stick or flashlight to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- Cross with caution. Parents and trick-or-treaters should cross streets

only at the corner, and never between parked cars or mid-block. Look left, right and left again, and be sure approaching cars come to a full stop before stepping into the roadway.

- Put down the phones. Parents and children should pay attention to their surroundings while walking. Talking, texting and social media can wait.

Motorists

- Avoid neighborhood shortcuts. If possible, keep off residential streets where trick-or-treaters are likely to be present.
- Slow down. What seems like a small difference can be the difference between life or death. Drive at least 5 mph below the posted speed limit to give yourself extra time to react to children, who might dart into the street. According to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, a pedestrian is more than twice as

likely to be killed if they are hit by a car traveling at 35 mph, compared to 25 mph.

- Watch for children. Trick-or-treaters might be more difficult to see at night, especially in dark costumes. Look for children walking on roadways, medians and curbs, particularly during popular trick-or-treating hours. Use extra caution when entering or exiting driveways.
- Remove distractions. Avoid any distraction that could take your attention away from driving, such as mobile phones.
- Don’t drink and drive. According to the NHTSA, more than 40% of traffic fatalities on Halloween involve a drunk driver.

Halloween is an opportunity to play dress-up and prowl neighborhoods for candy. Staying alert by proceeding with caution will help make sure the holiday is remembered for the right reasons.

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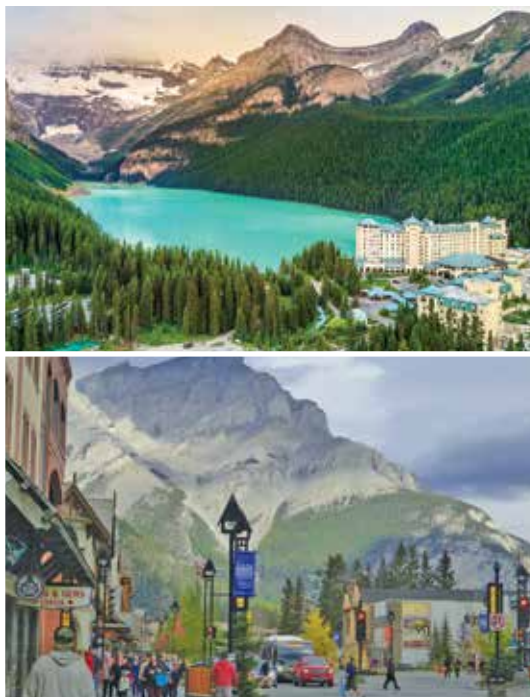

Emphasize safety during teen safety week

Parents should preach responsibility to kids behind wheel

Parents serve as role models to their children in a multitude of ways. The list is extensive and teaching proper driving habits should be near the top.

Driving could be considered a teenager's initial step on the stairway to adulthood. It's a responsibility to keep themselves and others among them from harm's way.

It's a skill that is honed, but never mastered. There is a threat of an accident each time a driver gets behind the wheel. Those who embrace the responsibility proceed with caution and put themselves at lesser risk than those who fail to take the task seriously.

It's not difficult to take driving for granted and ignore safe habits. Defensive approaches should be stressed and accepted by teenagers.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) understands the concerns parents might have regarding their children's driving routines and has deemed October 15-21 National Teen Driver Safety Week.

The NHTSA advises parents to focus on alcohol consumption, inconsistent use of seat belts, distracted driving, speeding and driving with a passenger in the vehicle. Parents also should engage in safe-driving conversations year-round.

Impaired driving never should be tolerated. Teens are too young to purchase and consume alcohol, but that doesn't stop them from getting into accidents. Thousands of teen drivers involved in fatal-car crashes have blood-alcohol-content levels higher than the legal limit of .08, according to the NHTSA.

But alcohol isn't the only substance that impacts driving. Marijuana affects a driver's ability to react. Teens should be reminded that driving under the

influence of any impaired substance, including illicit or prescription drugs, could have deadly consequences.

Seat belts are a simple way to keep drivers and passengers safe, but too many don't use them. NHTSA reports nearly 50% of teen passenger-vehicle drivers who die in car crashes are not wearing seat belts.

It's not difficult to become distracted while driving, but it's never smart to be using cellphones, answering texts

or browsing social-media sites while driving.

Speeding is another cause for teen drivers' fatal-car crashes. Parents can't stress enough the importance of driving defensively. Adhering to speed limits is essential in keeping young drivers from harm's way.

Research, meanwhile, has proved that teen drivers transporting passengers can dramatically increase the risk of fatal-car crashes. The likelihood of drivers engaging in risky behavior triples with multiple passengers.

Parents can best influence their children's driving behaviors by setting good examples. Never drive impaired. Seat belts should be fastened at all times, practice defensive driving, always obey the speed limit and limit the number of passengers.

National Teen Driver Safety Week is an ideal time to begin conversations with teen drivers for those who haven't. Get creative with the dialogue. Send email or text reminders to deliver a message and stress its importance. Draft a parent-teen contract that outlines the rules and consequences.

Driving is a privilege. Teens struggling to obey the rules might need to have their licenses taken away until they understand the importance of safety.

What You Need to Know About Your Car Battery

Your car battery supplies the electrical current that the starter motor needs to crank the engine. It powers components and accessories when the engine is not running and, when electrical loads temporarily exceed the car's charging system capacity, the battery supplies the needed extra current. The battery also acts as a voltage stabilizer for the entire electrical system. Today's vehicles have more electrical demands than ever before, and batteries play an essential role in meeting those demands.

While manufacturers are always working on improvements, today's car batteries generally fall into two basic design categories:

- Flooded lead acid (FLA), which has been the standard for decades.
- Absorbent glass mat (AGM),

a newer design that offers advantages in specific applications.

The flooded battery and glass mat battery serve the same basic function, but do not work interchangeably. It's important to consult your owner's manual before you purchase a replacement battery.

While most modern designs claim to be maintenance free, there are a few things you can do to get maximum life out of a battery. You can complete these steps yourself or ask your auto service tech when you bring your car in for routine maintenance.

- Check and clean the corrosion from each battery terminal.
- Check and tighten the mounting hardware so the battery does not move around when the car hits bumps in the road.

Even though the alternator

keeps it charged, there will come a time to replace the battery. Car batteries last three to five years typically depending on a few different factors, such as climate. If you live in a location where higher average temperatures are the norm, you can expect more frequent car battery replacements.

After the second year, it's a good practice to have your auto tech do an annual test to determine the battery's remaining energy capacity. It's far better to identify a weak battery in the service bay than to have a dead battery out on the road.

AAA EMERGENCY ROAD SERVICE RULES

AAA's 24-hour Emergency Road Service means there is always a person to call in case of an automotive emergency. We'll rescue you and your vehicle to get you back on the road as quickly as possible with a dedicated network of more than 13,000 Emergency Road Service facilities across the U.S.A. and Canada.

AAA assistance includes changing a flat tire, jumping a dead battery or mobile battery testing and replacement service, delivering emergency gasoline or fuel, lockout and key service, or when all else fails, towing your car. We'll provide the assistance to help you get behind the wheel again as quickly and safely as possible. No one provides better roadside assistance than AAA.

AAA Emergency Road Service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and is designed to assist you in an emergency when your vehicle, or the vehicle in which you are a passenger, becomes disabled. Your membership coverage applies only to those emergency and towing services listed in this guide. AAA coverage entitles each AAA member in the Primary Member's household up to 4 calls per membership year. After 4 calls, members will be charged for service.

Your AAA Membership Card is Your Key to Service

To receive emergency road service, you must present your AAA membership card or dues receipt and a matching driver's license, or other state or federally issued photo identification to the independent-service provider when the service vehicle arrives. Your identification may be scanned or swiped to verify your identity and authenticity of identification.

Service is available only to the person named on the membership card, who is the driver of or a passenger in the vehicle at the time of the vehicle disablement. AAA memberships are not transferable, and membership service is not provided to nonmembers. Other members of your household who want emergency road service must have their own membership cards, in their own names, to obtain service.

Unless a valid AAA membership card and matching valid driver's license or other state or federally issued photo identification are presented at the time of service, you will be required to pay for the service provided at commercial rates. A non-refundable service fee applies each time you use roadside assistance for the first three days of your membership. See AAA.com/servicefee for fee amount.

To Obtain Service

AAA is only a phone call or click away! In the case of an automotive emergency, call the AAA number listed on your AAA membership card. You'll be connected to our 24-hour dispatch center or the AAA club in the area from where you are calling. You can also request emergency-road service online at AAA.com, or via the Auto Club App, which can be downloaded free of charge. To help speed our response, be prepared to:

- Provide your name, membership number and your club code listed on your membership card.
- Give the exact location of your disabled vehicle and the nature of the trouble.
- Provide the vehicle's year, make, color and license plate number.
- If possible, provide a telephone number where you can be reached.

Allowable Roadside Assistance Calls

Each AAA cardholder is entitled to four (4) emergency-road service calls or reimbursements for personal, non-commercial use per membership year at no charge, provided the calls meet the conditions described in this guide. There will be a service charge for each additional service call after the fourth call or reimbursement. AAA may require immediate payment of a service charge by credit or debit card for Classic benefit level service before providing emergency-road service on the fifth or subsequent service request in a membership year.

Additional charges for emergency-road service beyond the Classic benefit level, such as towing beyond 3 miles, the cost of emergency fuel and excess vehicle locksmith services, will be payable by the member at the time of service. If the member is unable to provide a valid credit or debit card to AAA at the time-of-service request or the charge is not approved by the credit or debit card company, AAA may send service on a C.O.D. basis, meaning all charges payable by the member will be paid directly to the independent-service provider at the time of service. If a cardholder has an unpaid service-charge balance and contacts AAA for emergency road service, AAA may require immediate payment of both the unpaid balance and the service charge for the current service call before providing service. The nonpayment of a service charge may result in cancellation of membership.

Mechanical First Aid

The AAA emergency service representative will make minor mechanical repairs or adjustments to place a vehicle in safe-driving condition. If needed and available, parts and the labor cost to install them are to be paid by the member. If the vehicle cannot be put into condition to proceed under its own power, towing service, as described in Towing Services, will be provided.

Flat Tire Service

If the vehicle's spare tire is inflated and serviceable, it will be installed in place of the vehicle's flat tire. If not, towing provisions will apply.

AAA Battery Service

AAA Battery Service is a mobile battery testing and replacement service. The AAA Battery Service technician will test and assess the vehicle's battery and electrical system. If the existing battery fails the test and the member would like to have the battery replaced, the member can purchase a AAA battery. The technician will install a new battery, if available, that meets or exceeds the vehicle's original specifications. Each AAA Premium battery is backed by a limited warranty that includes a 3-year free replacement guarantee. AAA Battery Service is generally provided by independent-service providers and is only available in select areas, during select hours. Batteries are available for most makes and models. Battery prices vary depending on vehicle make and model. Copies of the warranties are available for inspection from the technician at any time upon request. Membership emergency road service terms and conditions apply.

Fuel Delivery Service

An emergency supply of fuel will be delivered to a member's disabled vehicle enabling the member to reach the nearest service station. The member will be charged for the fuel at current pump prices. Specific quantities, brand, or octane ratings cannot be promised, nor can availability.

AAA Plus provides sufficient free emergency fuel to enable you to reach the nearest service station, when your vehicle runs out of fuel.

Towing Services

When your vehicle cannot be safely driven after attempting any of the listed emergency services, your vehicle will be towed (once per breakdown) to the facility rendering the service, or up to 3 miles in any direction from the point of disablement at no charge. Charges for service that exceed the benefits listed will be at the prevailing hourly or mileage rate for the region where service is provided. In instances when your vehicle becomes disabled while towing a light-duty trailer, service will be provided for the trailer. You will be required to pay for trailer towing. All vehicles must be free of snow and ice prior to towing.

AAA Plus provides up to 100 miles of free towing, in any direction from the point of disablement, to the repair facility of your choice.

AAA Premier increases one tow to a maximum 200 miles plus a free one-day rental car.

Extrication/Winchin

Your vehicle will be pulled out of a ditch by being extricated/winchd when it can be safely reached from a normally traveled or established thoroughfare (driveways must be cleared of snow or ice). If special equipment, additional service personnel or vehicles are required, the associated costs will be at your expense.

AAA Plus provides a second truck and second driver, for up to one hour, if your situation requires it.

Emergency Check Acceptance

Club and contract facilities will accept payment by check, credit or debit card for payment of emergency-road service charges up to \$250 per occurrence.

Lockout Service

If your keys are locked inside the vehicle, services will be sent to gain entrance. If your keys are lost, broken, or the service provider cannot gain entrance to your vehicle, locksmith services up to \$60 or, if a AAA locksmith is not available, reimbursement for locksmith service up to \$60, will be provided. In cases where the vehicle cannot be made operable, towing services will be provided according to our towing provision.

AAA Plus provides up to a total of \$100 in parts and labor to gain entry or make vehicle operable.

AAA Premier provides up to \$150 for Vehicle Locksmith, \$100 Home Lockout Service reimbursement.

Service Limitations

Emergency-road service will be limited to that which can be provided with equipment ordinarily used by the independent-service provider serving the area. Service will not be provided when the disabled vehicle cannot be safely reached or serviced without damage to the vehicle or servicing equipment.

SERVICE INCLUSIONS

Towing service is only provided for a covered vehicle disablement. Service may not be used as a substitute for regular maintenance necessary to keep a vehicle in good operating condition. AAA cannot render service repeatedly to a vehicle in need of repair. Service is intended for personal, non-commercial use, and only provided for a covered vehicle disablement. An individual's AAA membership may not be used by a business or organization to provide roadside-assistance service for its customers, employees or vehicles, including, but not limited to taxicabs, limousines, shuttles and other commercial vehicles for hire.

The following services are not provided under the membership benefit:

- Servicing or extrication of vehicles on inaccessible streets, back roads, driveways, parking lots or alleys that become snowbound or flooded.
 - Shoveling snow from around a vehicle or cleaning a road or driveway.
 - Service to a vehicle located in an area not regularly traveled by private-passenger vehicles (such as beach, open field, creek bed, private logging or forest service road).
 - Towing to or from auto dismantlers, salvage yards, repair facility to repair facility or from one storage location to another.
 - Towing for the purpose of transporting vehicles due to a purchase, sale, renovation, auction transaction, car show exhibition, charitable donation, relocation or any other similar situation.
 - Service to a vehicle that is loaded, altered or constructed in such a way as to cause damage or create a hazard while being serviced.
 - Charges related to impound or stolen-vehicle recovery, towing or storage.
 - Tire rotation, the installation or removal of snow tires or tire chains.
 - Cost of vehicle locksmith services beyond what is necessary to place the vehicle in a condition to be safely driven (such as duplicating keys, nonemergency lock repairs and re-keying of vehicle locks).
 - Service in situations where the membership card and matching valid driver's license or other state or federally issued photo identification is not provided to the service driver. You must provide a driver's license for identification if you are the driver.
 - Use of two or more roadside-assistance service calls to extend the member tow-mileage benefit for the same breakdown.
 - AAA Plus® members will be responsible for any additional mileage charges beyond 100 driving miles of towing per roadside-assistance call. AAA Premier® members will be responsible for any additional mileage charges beyond 200 driving miles of towing on one roadside-assistance service call per AAA Premier® household per membership year and beyond 100 driving miles of towing on the remaining allowable roadside-assistance service calls.
 - Towing, extrication/winchin and tire-change service for RVs and towing and extrication and winching services for motorcycles, unless the member has optional AAA Plus RV® or AAA Premier RV® coverage.
 - AAA Plus RV® members are entitled up to \$500 per allowable service call, and up to \$1,000 total per household per membership year on allowable RV/ Motorcycle service calls. Members will be responsible for all other costs of roadside service above that amount.
 - AAA Plus®, AAA Premier®, AAA Plus RV® and AAA Premier RV® emergency-road service is available 7 calendar days after purchase date if paid in full.
 - Without limiting any other rights or remedies it may have, AAA may seek reimbursement from a member or associate for roadside-assistance services fraudulently or wrongfully obtained by the member or associate. Primary members are responsible for the conduct and the service demands of their associates.
- Extended Roadside Assistance services for AAA Plus®, AAA Plus® RV, AAA Premier® or AAA Premier® RV benefit levels, where available, and certain AAA Premier benefits are effective seven (7) calendar days after processing, and receipt of the full payment due.
- Special Assistance**
- When your vehicle cannot be made operable upon providing the services listed in this guide, AAA will assist you in finding the nearest open place of repair. If a repair facility cannot be located, we will assist you in obtaining lodging or alternate transportation, which will be at your expense.
- Eligible Vehicles**
- Service applies to 4-wheeled motor-driven vehicles of the passenger, pleasure or recreational type that

were in operation immediately prior to disablement - provided that services can be safely delivered. If specific towing equipment is requested, but not required to safely transport the vehicle, the associated cost will be at your expense.

Automobiles, pickup trucks, sport utility vehicles, vans and minivans are eligible for those services which can be safely performed with equipment available from the independent-service provider, including slings, wheel-lift devices, car carriers (flatbeds) and dolly wheels. Dual-wheel unloaded pickup trucks are eligible for all services except tire services.

Motorcycle coverage is available with optional AAA Plus RV® coverage. Motorcycles (as defined by registration) must be licensed for highway use.

Recreational Vehicles (RVs) are eligible for service, with the exception of towing, extrication/winchin and tire-change service. Towing, extrication/winchin and tire service for RVs is available with optional AAA Plus RV® and AAA Premier RV® coverage. RVs include dual-wheel motorhomes, camper vans and cabover campers, motorcycles, and recreational trailers including camping trailers, fifth-wheel trailers and empty horse trailers. Boat trailers, personal watercraft trailers and ATV trailers must be either empty or transporting recreational vehicles or equipment. Utility trailers must be carrying recreational equipment (for non-commercial use). Commercial trailers are excluded. Service does not include transportation of horses.

Unable to Locate the Vehicle

If a service provider does not appear within the time stated by the AAA customer service representative, please call AAA back to let us know. The service provider may not have been able to locate your vehicle.

Cancel Unnecessary Calls

If the requested service is no longer needed and the AAA service representative has not yet arrived, please call AAA immediately, as each service call is charged against the member's record.

Weather Emergencies

During severe weather conditions, AAA reserves the right to suspend service temporarily if the vehicle is already in a place of safety, such as a private or public garage, driveway, etc. AAA will provide service to the vehicle after the weather emergency is over.

Alternate Service

If you have followed the procedure outlined to obtain emergency-road service, and AAA service is not available, you may obtain your own service, pay for it and submit the original receipt to your AAA club within 60 days. Reimbursement will be based on the prevailing commercial rate for the region where the vehicle was disabled. In instances where the AAA contractor access is legally restricted (toll roads, limited-access highways), reimbursement will be provided for all covered services. If AAA service was available, but not requested, reimbursement may be limited to the amount the club would normally have paid for the covered service.

No reimbursements will be made by AAA on charges incurred when a member's vehicle is removed from the street or under direction of the police because of illegal parking, traffic violations, or other illegal activities. Storage charges and cleanup fees from the scene of a traffic accident are also not eligible for reimbursement.

Members having more than 4 road-service calls during their membership year are not eligible for alternate service reimbursement.

Member's Risk

Before servicing any vehicle when there is a possibility of damage to the vehicle or other property as a result of the service, a service representative will inform the member that the member must assume the risk of damage. Any such circumstances should be fully recorded on a release form.

While AAA-affiliated service providers are selected to provide the best emergency-road service to our members, such providers are independent contractors and are not agents of AAA. AAA assumes no responsibility for any injuries to persons or property, including damage to the member's vehicle, as a result of an emergency-road service request.

AAA will make every reasonable effort to work out a settlement between a member and an affiliated service provider of the member's claim for damages resulting from unsatisfactory emergency road service.
